History

The Renaissance

My favourite period of History is the Renaissance. I think the children of 6th Class would benefit greatly from an indepth study of this period. It was an era of change - socially, culturally and most importantly in the way in which people viewed the world. I always enjoy and learn something new from reading about this period and I hope that you gain as much pleasure as I have done.

The term Renaissance refers to a rebirth. In the context of the Italian Renaissance it refers to a rebirth in interest in the culture, politics and way of life of ancient Greece and Ancient Rome. The Renaissance began in Florence around 1450 in a period when Europe was emerging from the devastation of the Black Death. Rulers in Europe began to look back in time to periods where Europe was a more prosperous and nicer place to live. This led to Rulers in Europe and

intellectual thinkers to reflect on the glories of Ancient Greece/Rome and attempt to recreate the values and virtues of those eras. In many ways however the Renaissance was merely a minority movement of a few scholars and artists who were patronised by princes and rich merchants whose views gradually circulated throughout Europe by means of the recently invented printing press – an invention which was as powerful as today's internet.

Over this two week period I would like children to do a short project on one feature of the Renaissance – a key figures from the Renaissance, developments in art, scientific discoveries etc.



Children Under Thirteen Should Not Be Allowed on Social Media

Mark Zuckerberg wants to open up the Facebook social networking website to children under 13, but is that such a good idea? I don't think so.

Cyberbullying is a problem that no one knows how to fix. Children have always dealt with


Malicious posts or pictures that **circulate** on social media go far and wide. It is difficult to reverse the awful damage that these can do.

Children my age do not think about the effect of the statements and pictures that they post online. Anything that goes on social media can potentially remain there forever. Posts that look cool to your peer group today might be harshly judged by people who look at your social media in the future. We should not be expected at this age to make **sophisticated** judgements about what we post online, just as we are not expected to be on juries or to operate vehicles or heavy machinery.

Us children have plenty to be thinking about as it is. We experience enough pressure without having to try to maintain an interesting social media presence. Being exposed to pictures of people who appear to be living more exciting, glamorous lives than us can have a depressing effect.

More and more children are suffering from obesity. Adding social media to the already long list of video games, YouTube channels and other distractions that keep us from pursuing fit and active lifestyles is a bad idea. According to psychologists, social media is highly addictive. Many of our parents cannot even go a couple of hours without checking theirs. We would have a lot less time for sports and activities if social media sites were introduced to our lives.

Social media accounts are not necessary. Many of us might want them, but we do not need them. We certainly do not need the problems that come with social media. I will gladly wait a couple of years before I sign up for a social media account in order to protect myself from being bullied or made **vulnerable** to strangers and advertising. I'll stick with real-life human friends for now.
